The 17 goal-oriented songs in this book support outdoor play for children with and without disabilities. Text accompanying each song offers connections between the music and learning opportunities (e.g., songs can teach names). All songs have been created in clinical practice settings and sung many times by children, teachers, and therapists. Strategies for successful implementation and suggestions for different ability levels are included.
